Pilot Study: Adaptation of Critical Time Intervention for Rapid Rehousing Participants

This study aims to adapt Critical Time Intervention for use with individuals and families participating in Rapid Rehousing Programs. Using data from focus groups and a literature review, we designed a new case management model that will be implemented across 12 agencies in Connecticut in 2017. This is a multi year grant with the long term goal of producing a new evidence based practice for use in homeless service agencies nationwide.
