

Creating a Graded Discussion Board

Setting Up a Discussion Board

1. Select the **Unit** you are adding your discussion to. Scroll to **Discussion Forum** and click on the **Action Link** that comes up directly next to the name.



2. Click Edit on the menu that pops up.



3. Enter the **Link Name**. It is good to keep the name short and give it a number so that you can easily find it in the gradebook.

4. In **Text**, enter basic information about the discussion topic as well as due dates and requirements. This will appear on the **Unit Page**.



5. By default, the discussion board is made **Available** to students. If you need to hide the **Discussion Board** from the students you can select **No**.

6. Change **Track Number of Views** to **Yes**. If this is not switched to yes, then you will not will be able to get data/reports on the discussion board later on. You also have the option to limit the forum availability to students by entering date and time restrictions.



7. Click Submit.




Choosing Grading Settings


1. Click on the **Discussion Board**.



2. Click on Edit This Forum at the top of the screen.



3. Reenter the Name of the Discussion Forum.




- 4. Leave the Forum Description field empty.
- 5. Scroll down to **Forum** Settings. **Viewing Threads/Replies** is set to **Standard View** by default. This means that the professor must create the first thread which will include the discussion question/prompt and then the students will respond to that thread.

6. Click on **Grade Discussion Forum** and next to **Points Possible**, add the **Points** needed for grading. Putting in 100 points can help for grading consistency.


7. Choose how many posts students should submit before it shows up as **Needs Grading**..

10. If you have a rubric that you previously created, you can add it by choosing **Select Rubric**.






Creating the First Thread

1. Click on the Discussion Board.




2. Click Create Thread.
